

Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Wednesday, April 3, 2013 at 7:00 P.M.

Commissioner Todd Howell called the meeting to order.

John Ur, Clerk: Mr. President – All the requirements of the “Open Public Meeting Act” have been complied with by advertising in the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger. Copies of the meeting notice have been sent to the Municipal Clerk’s Office and posted on the bulletin boards of the fire house and the post offices of Woodbridge and Sewaren. Mr. President, you may proceed.

Commissioner Todd Howell led a pledge to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed for our departed members and all our troops that are under arms throughout the world.

Commissioner John C. Kenny made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 6th, 2012 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Ken Gardner and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Committee Reports – Personnel.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PERSONNEL:

Commissioner T.H.: I’ll report that everything is going along fine. We have no problems, no sickness and they’re be moving into the section of the year where we start vacations. Building and Grounds – Commissioner Gardner.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:

Commissioner K.G.: Thank you Mr. President. Tonight I have with me some selections we have to make for the upstairs dormitory bathroom project. The architect had made some recommendations to us. If any of you are interested in looking at the tile type and color selection and different things like the partitions for the toilets etc. if anyone wants to look at those things I can show them to you after the meeting. The back of the roof on the building still has to be patched. However today we had a gentleman stop by that’s working as a consultant to the JIF and to the township, I believe it’s to the township through the JIF. We were able to confirm

through Mr. Landolfi that he's working with them. He asked that we hold off before fixing the roof and that had been planned to be done on Saturday. The gentleman said he'll be back here within a few weeks to take a look to see if there is any other damage up there that needs to be addressed so he can lobby the reinsurance company on our behalf for that. We'll wait for that.

Commissioner T.H.: Pat, did you tell him about the roofer?

Commissioner K.G.: I left a message for the roofer. I know Captain Kenny sent out an e-mail to.....I had asked him to send an e-mail to all of the officers letting them know they were coming Saturday. I'll send another e-mail and I'll say that's been changed once we have the other guy look at it and get the okay to move forward. We haven't had any problem with the roof although we're missing some shingles. We haven't had any leaks or anything else so there's no real urgency of moving forward right away. That's all I have for now.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, thank you.

EQUIPMENT:

Commissioner T.H.: Under Equipment I'll report that we're moving into the time of year, this month, when we send the three pumpers for pm and I've been in contact with Campbell to schedule it when they can get it into the shop. Otherwise it's just normal usual repairs. Purchasing – Commissioner Gardner.

PURCHASING:

Commissioner K.G.: Just the normal purchasing.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. Fire Prevention.

FIRE PREVENTION:

Commissioner T.H.: In the absence of Commissioner Gould would Patrick Kenny care to make a comment?

Commissioner P.K.: Sure. Under Fire Prevention we had a fire today. I know who did the investigation. DeNezi determined the fire. The other night they had a fire in Port Reading that we went out on mutual aid and he led the investigation. He actually came up with the determination of that fire and what caused it so we're two for two of determining fires after all our training. The Bureau is out doing their inspections. They've fallen a little bit behind so we're trying to make up with that. If we have to attack the shifts we will but right now we're going along trying to get everything done. Do you want to go right into Radios and Hydrants?

Commissioner T.H.: Fine.

RADIO AND HYDRANTS:

Commissioner P.K.: Radios and Hydrants, we removed the radio out of the chief's car and 1,3,2 so this way they can be put into the new vehicles which did arrive last month and they'll be going out soon to get all their equipment put in and the radios and the letter. The one question on the chief's car for the Board, and you can let me know after the meeting, just how you want it lettered. Do we want the trumpets on it? We're going to do the stick gold leaf lettering not the hand gold leaf lettering.

Commissioner T.H.: Stick on.

Commissioner P.K.: So I need to know if we're going to keep it like the other cars like 1,3,7 or are we going to put the chief's emblems on there or how you want to do it. Just give me some ideas later on this way I can get that priced out and ready to go.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner P.K.: On the chief's car the radios are up except for one which is going out for repair. On the Hydrants all the hydrants are up. There was a hydrant that was knocked down by 500 Green Street. That has turned into a double steamer now from what it used to be and the fire officer was working with Lord & Taylor's today to get the easement to help the water company. They've come into a snag basically to get the easement for the twelve inch water line for the Jewelry Exchange which is going to actually boast all the water up there when we get that connection. So the fire official is working with the water company and myself to get that approval so we can get that moving. Other than that everything is in progress going along.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. Safety – Commissioner Gardner.

SAFTEY:

Commissioner K.G.: Thank you Mr. President. The only thing and I'll ask Patrick if you would just speak on the air packs for a minute on that.

Commissioner P.K.: We received four of the new air packs. I know Monday night Captain Golden actually gave a quick training class on them. What they're going to do is he's going to remove the air packs off of the ladder truck and put the new ones on the ladder truck and bump the ones from the ladder truck down to where they're going to go on the engines. We'll have another four coming in and we're slowly replacing. At the same time Captain Golden with Firefighter Dellapietro from Fords and the Grant writer from the township are all working in conjunction together to try to do another Grant for more air packs to see what we can get out there putting all three together to see if we can get some more funding for that to get more packs. But we're coming in compliance of what we need to do for the air packs.

Commissioner K.G.: We talked a little bit about that and he was saying that he thinks there might be some problems because it's different metrics.

Commissioner P.K.: We're trying to work out now to see if we can make that change happen.

Commissioner K.G.: Okay and the Safety Committee had talked a while ago about putting the R.I.D. pack in action so he's taking a look at the old R.I.D. pack trying to get some fittings for the new pieces and the new packs, you know, have a couple of different features on them that make them better to hook into either the R.I.D. pack or another bottle. It makes it easier if you have a firefighter go down. In addition he also had purchased a wand, he was calling it. It helps to locate the pack if a firefighter is down. We didn't have a demonstration on it for one but he was saying that it was very impressive so I guess you worked with him on that as well.

Commissioner P.K.: Yes.

Commissioner K.G.: So that's been a while in coming. Just to follow on that with the Grants I'm sure the Board had seen John and had expressed the interest in working on these Grants so I've asked them to update all of the demographic information and the other base information so he'll be working with Fire Prevention to do that. We've also talked to Congressman Pallone's office. They're going to let us know when there's any training coming up or give us advised notice as to when the opening of the Grant period would be so that we make sure we have everything in place and we'll have a more successful application for the future. That's all I have, thank you.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. Would you like to cover Liaison to the Volunteer Fire Company, Commissioner Gardner, while you have the floor?

LIAISON TO THE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY:

Commissioner K.G.: Yes, there are members of the volunteer company here tonight. We can have an Executive Session on the matter. I don't think there's anything else pressing at this point but there so many members here so they'll let me know.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, thank you. Report of Payroll and Bills.

The report of Payroll and Bills for March, 2013:

John Ur: The report of Payroll and Bills for the month of March, 2013.

Bills: \$715,696.80 Payroll: \$185,771.04

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. I also have some add-on bills to be included in the motion to accept John's report. The add-on bills are as follows: Elizabethtown Gas -

\$1,335.56; GBC Chemical Corporation \$4,246.00; Occupational Health Services - \$228.00; Township of Woodbridge - \$180.00; Valic - \$25,968.00 and Public Service Electric & Gas not to exceed \$2,000.00 and InterGlobe not to exceed \$200.00.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Payroll and Bills plus add-on bills for the month of March, 2013 which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Next item, Treasurer's Report.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as read which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Communications.

COMMUNICATIONS:

John Ur: All communications Mr. President have been passed through to the Board.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. Unfinished Business – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Commissioner P.K.: I have one thing under Unfinished Business. Well, I guess I have two actually under Unfinished Business. Number one is the promotional fire lieutenant. I'd like to talk about that in Executive Session on that. I did the interviews and I'd like to discuss it with the Board for an announcement. Two is Port Reading for Durango 132. They expressed their interest. I talked to Commissioner Galvach who is a committee of one I believe from Port Reading. We've gone back and forth going with the Blue Book Kelly value and everything. I have expressed to

him that this district would like to get two thousand eight hundred dollars for the Durango the way it is, as is. If the Board here approves it we would do an interlocal and we would write it up tonight and just doing an interlocal with District #2 in the amount of twenty-eight hundred dollars for that vehicle. We would express that to them. If it passes from us then they would bring it up at their meeting on Monday. If they pass it then the transaction would take place. I'm looking for the Board's approval to go and enter into an interlocal agreement with District #2 in the amount of twenty-eight hundred dollars for the Durango 132 for them to purchase.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion for the Board's approval to enter into an interlocal agreement with District #2 in the amount of twenty-eight hundred dollars for the Durango 132 which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner P.K.: Thank you for your support and I will make Commissioner Galvach know that he can bring it up to his meeting next week. If they approve it I will make sure I will reach out to all Board members to let them know that it was approved. That's all I have under Unfinished Business.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay. Unfinished Business - Commissioner Jack Kenny

Commissioner J.C.K.: None.

Commissioner T.H.: None, Commissioner Gardner.

Commissioner R.G.: Yes Mr. President. I had brought forward the information on the dental coverage for the union and forwarded that information to Mr. Repace so we're just waiting for a response.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. I have nothing under Unfinished Business. We'll move into New Business – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

NEW BUSINESS:

Commissioner P.K.: I don't think I have anything. I think I covered it all under Unfinished Business.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay. Commissioner Kenny.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I only have one thing. It seems that I guess down in the state there is some type of bill they're trying to pass in the legislation or not. I don't have it right to the (inaudible) so what there is and it was vetoed was there was some type of bill that would say that if you had mutual aide that if you didn't have a deputy chief or higher as the incident commander and mutual aide came in to let's say here, like our highest ranking either a chief or it's a career captain, the mutual aide deputy chief could become the incident commander at the scene. But I'll try to get more

information on that but I understand that it was vetoed but I understand there's still a life of this bill.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner K.G.: And there was talk about that in the volunteer chief's letter maybe two or three months ago. I still have the letter but we could contact their president.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay.

Commissioner K.G.: And I did actually speak to both of our assemblymen about that saying that, you know, I didn't think that bill would be very good for us and it also dealt with red teams and there were a lot of things in there that I think that made it look like our firemen were not qualified when in fact, you know, we've been doing that same job for years and doing it well.

Commissioner T.H.: It would seem to me that our officers here would know more about our fire district and our operations than an outsider coming in regardless of rank, just as a point.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Right.

Commissioner T.H.: Patrick, do you want to read that.....

Commissioner P.K.: Oh yeah, I actually have something under New Business. I knew I had one. I'm not going to read it in its entirety, its three pages long or two pages long. I'm going to paraphrase it. It's a Resolution authorizing the award of a non-fair and opened contract for legal services. Whereas the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District #1 Woodbridge, New Jersey have a need to acquire legal services as a non-fair and opened contract pursuant to the provisions of NJSA 1944A-20.4 or 20.5 as appropriate and whereas the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District #1 Woodbridge, New Jersey have determined and certified in writing that the value of acquisition will exceed \$17,500.00 and whereas the anticipated terms of this contract is for one year and may be extended each calendar year there from as approved by the governing body and whereas the law offices of Christopher T. Howell, Esquire and Eric Bernstein have submitted proposals February 5th, 2013 indicating that they will provide legal services for the Woodbridge Board of Fire Commissioners for the flat fee of \$48,000.00 beginning on March 1st, 2013 and ending on February 28th, 2014 and whereas the law offices of Christopher T. Howell, Esquire and Eric Bernstein have completed and submitted a business entirety disclosure certification which certifies that law offices of Christopher T. Howell, Esquire and Eric Bernstein have not made any reportable contributions to the political candidate committee of the Board of Fire Commissioners First District #1 Woodbridge, New Jersey in the previous one year and that the contract will prohibit the law offices of Christopher T. Howell, Esquire and Eric Bernstein for making any

reportable contributions through the term of the contract and whereas John Ur, Clerk of the Woodbridge Board of Fire Commissioners has hereby certified that the amount of the contact to be awarded exceeds seventeen thousand five hundred and is to the availability of the accurate funds on the appropriate line items of the official budget to which the contract will probably charge as required to pursuant to NJSE 530-534. Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District #1 Woodbridge, New Jersey authorizes John Kenny to enter into a contract with the law offices of Christopher T. Howell, Esquire and Eric Bernstein as subscribed here in. Be it further resolved that two year vendor certification business disclosure entitled certificates and determinable of value of vendor New Jersey Business Registration certification be placed on file with the Resolution of the same has been electronically filed with the State of New Jersey Chapter 51 review unit and be it further resolved that the clerk of the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District #1 Woodbridge, New Jersey shall forth with cause to be print once in the newspaper authorized by law and published in the legal advertisement of a brief notice stating the nature, duration, services, amount of contract and that the Resolution and contract on file are available for public inspection in the office of the clerk as required by NJSA 40A11-5:1:A:I. I hereby certify that the above is a true and accurate copy of this Resolution adopted by the Board of Fire Commissioners District #1 Township of Woodbridge, New Jersey at the regular meeting I adopted. I'd like to make a motion for that sir.

Commissioner Pat Kenny made a motion for the Resolution authorizing the award of a non-fair and opened contract for legal services which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously by a roll call vote except for Commissioner Todd Howell abstaining.

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, just for your record after the last meeting both of those advertisements were placed in the newspapers already so that part was done. This is just the last formal part and the vice president has to sign it or somebody has to sign it.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, anybody else have anything under New Business? Hearing nothing we'll entertain Remark, Comments or Questions from the Audience starting off with the Assistant Chief's remarks.

Robert Minkler, Woodbridge: Just an FYI Mr. President, the minutes for 2013 were not online. Nothing has been posted for January, February or March.

Maria Bucsanszky: No, that's not true. It should be.

Robert Minkler, Woodbridge: I was just on it and it wasn't there.

Commissioner T.H.: Did you go on the new site?

Maria Bucsanszky: The new one? You might be on the old website.

Robert Minkler, Woodbridge: It's not under Fire Prevention no more?

Maria Bucsanszky: No.

Commissioner T.H.: No.

Commissioner J.C.K.: No.

Commissioner P.K.: It changed by law.

Commissioner T.H.: By law we had to change. We used to be a link off the Fire Prevention and now we have a new website that's for the Board and Fire Prevention

is a link off of ours so that's why you didn't find it. Maybe we should have announced that but it is online.

Robert Minkler, Woodbridge: Okay.

There was some smoke damage and some fire damage to the kitchen but both career and volunteer again as Chief Hapstak said before worked well together and did a good job for the residents of Woodbridge.

Commissioner T.H.: Any other comments? I'll entertain a motion for Executive Session.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to go into Executive Session for personal matters which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously at 7:25 P.M.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to return to the regular meeting at 7:49 P.M. which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: At this time I'll call on Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

Commissioner K.G.: The attorney got the say.

Commissioner T.H.: Oh yeah, the attorney. Excuse me. I'll call upon our attorney to make a report as to what we discussed in our Executive Session meeting.

Christopher Howell: The Board of Commissioners met in special session due the promotion to the lieutenant.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you.

Commissioner P.K.: We have a special meeting on April 10th, 2013 so I'd like the clerk's office if they could to send a letter out to newly appointed Lieutenant Minkler, Jr. to be at the meeting for 7:00 P.M. that night to be sworn in as lieutenant. He'll be placed on a shift assignment. That's all I have.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to take a recess until Henry Fisher arrives for the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously at 7:51 P.M.

Commissioner T.H.: We'll just take a recess and we're going to go back into Executive Session with the members that are here of the volunteer company but we'll like to wait for Henry to be here.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to return to the regular meeting at 8:01 P.M. which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.
