

**Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Wednesday, October 2, 2013 at 7:00 P.M.**

Commissioner Todd Howell called the meeting to order.

John Ur: Mr. President – All the requirements of the “Open Public Meeting Act” have been complied with by advertising in the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger. Copies of the meeting notice have been sent to the Municipal Clerk’s Office and posted on the bulletin boards of the fire house and the post offices of Woodbridge and Sewaren. Mr. President, you may proceed.

Commissioner Todd Howell led a pledge to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed for our former members and for the family of our late member, Frank Meyers, and our troops throughout the world.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2013 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**PERSONNEL:**

Commissioner T.H.: I’ll just report progress; we have no problems. Buildings and Grounds.

**BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:**

Commissioner T.H.: In the absence of Mr. Gardner I would point out that he just said that under House and Purchasing he is making progress with ongoing matters. Equipment.

**EQUIPMENT:**

Commissioner T.H.: Our equipment is up and running. We have no problems. Purchasing.

**PURCHASING:**

Commissioner T.H.: I believe I covered that under the previously mentioned Mr. Gardner. Fire Prevention – Patrick Kenny.

**FIRE PREVENTION:**

Commissioner P.K.: The waterline down at Woodbridge High School is connected. They installed 250 feet of eight inch pipe. The next couple of weeks the Fire Prevention Bureau will conduct a water flow if time permits. The Lord & Taylor and Jewelry Exchange waterline project has started. The Fire Prevention Bureau will keep the Board up to date on that one. Something that we talked about last month was the smoke detectors that I believe Commissioner J.C. Kenny said that we need to get out there. The Bureau handed out over 250 flyers for a smoke detector program during the St. James Street Fair and it has been posted on TV35. As of today they have not received any calls for this program and they will hand out flyers during the upcoming events and will hand them out during the religious services. If there are any other suggestions please let the Lieutenant of Fire Prevention know. October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2013 is the open house from 5:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. The flyer has been sent to all the schools, daycares and has been posted on TV35. There was an error made in reviewing the cost of the permits for the St. James Street Fair. The Lieutenant received clarification from the state of the amount charged for the permit would only be \$42.00 and that was the confusion on the Bureau's part. Other than that the Fire Prevention are going through all their Fire Prevention shows for the month of October, Fire Prevention Month, and at the end of the November meeting we'll have a report of how many shows they did. We'll keep everybody updated on the smoke detector program that we're trying to work on with Local 290 and the Board. That's all I have.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you, under Radios and Hydrants.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Excuse me.

Commissioner T.H.: Go ahead.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I was looking for the Fire Prevention to reach out to the AARP and the senior groups to go there and give a presentation.

Commissioner P.K.: Which I believe they were working on and trying to get that done but right now with this Fire Prevention week and all the schools that.....I mean month more or less, it's not even week any more it's month, as soon as that's over they'll be going into November. I know Lisa has been working on trying to get in touch with those groups to get up there and speak to them.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Right, that's why I brought it up last month because they had the whole month of September to start the lineup.

Commissioner P.K.: They actually jumped on it and they've acted on it and they've gotten the word out there.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, that's great; that's great.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, Radio and Hydrants – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

**RADIO AND HYDRANTS:**

Commissioner P.K.: Radio and Hydrants – Everything is status quo from last month except for the two borderline projects that I already mentioned.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, thank you.

**SAFTEY:**

Commissioner T.H.: Under Safety, Commissioner Gardner asked that I report that his committee has met and they're reviewing the SOGs for recommendation to the Board and it's in progress and should be happening soon.

**LIAISON TO THE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY:**

Commissioner T.H.: Under Liaison To The Volunteer Fire Company in the absence of Commissioner Gardner I would just report that the department yesterday attended the funeral of our late member, Frank Meyer, who passed away last Friday and we did a very nice job and I would report not only to the Board but to the Volunteer Company President that's here and the Union President that's here is the family, today, I spoke to them and they expressed their sincere and deepest thanks to the members of this department and the entire department for everything that we did to help them in their time of need. I also would say that I appreciate all the help that everyone gave us, thank you.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I think that (inaudible) was outstanding. It was a good turnout from past and present on both sides.

Commissioner T.H.: Right, Report of Payroll and Bills.

Commissioner P.K.: I'll make a motion to accept the Payrolls and Bills.

Commissioner T.H.: Would you amend your motion to have the add-on bill for Olsen's Garage, we had to have the brakes repaired on Car 164, in the amount of \$621.00.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Payroll and Bills and the add-on bill for the month of September, 2013 which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you – Treasurer's Report.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as read which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Communications.

**COMMUNICATIONS:**

John Ur: All communications Mr. President have all been passed through to the Board.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you, Unfinished Business – Patrick Kenny

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Commissioner P.K.: The only thing I have is we reached out to the state to find out where the report is from the fire on Harrell Avenue and the gentleman that did the report said he turned it into his people so I'm going to send an email to State Fire Marshall Kramer and find out where the report and how come it hasn't been sent back to us so that we can make corrections and do what we need to do to make sure that our firefighters and the people of our district are safe in the future.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, Jack Kenny.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Nothing; zero.

Commissioner T.H.: I would report Unfinished Business, in lieu of Commissioner Gardner being here, that under the Grants that's he's been working on he says he has mailed the township fire officer's list asking if any other district is interested in joining our RCPA Grant. So far only Colonia has replied and progress is ongoing. We'll leave it at that and I have nothing further under Unfinished Business myself.  
New Business – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Commissioner P.K. I have a couple of things there. We have a letter each commissioner should have it, from Employee 1820 requesting family leave for two to three weeks to care for a spouse of the family. I'd like to make a motion to grant the family leave and have the proper report drawn up from the Clerk's Office.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to grant family leave for Employee 1820 as requested which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner P.K.: The next thing I'd like to open up is to get permission from the Board for myself and Commissioner Howell, the Equipment Chairman, to enter into talks with Hopelawn Fire District #8. Just like us they'll be receiving a new apparatus come next year around the same time as us if not a little later and they'll be getting rid of one of their pumpers. I'd like to try to go into talks with them to see what they were looking for to sell it. Maybe we can replace Engine One with that this way we'd have the two new ones and then we can work a deal out with them to replace Engine One. So I'm looking for permission from the Board for me and Commissioner Howell to speak to Hopelawn.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion for himself and Commissioner Howell to speak to Hopelawn Fire District #8 about selling one of their pumpers they are replacing which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner P.K.: The only other thing I want to tell everybody is on October 25<sup>th</sup> and October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at the old A&P is going to be the Woodbridge High School Haunted House so everybody is aware of that. The building is fully sprinkled. I know they have been in contact with the Bureau already and the Building Department and everybody else for that. I don't think we're going to need anything for that but I'm waiting for the fire official to get back to me to let me know what we might have to have out there. He says one guy so once he lets me know we'll do the appropriate coverage that we need to cover for it. It's supposed to be very crowded this year because it actually is a home football game on that Friday night I believe so that's all I have under New Business.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, Jack.

Commissioner J.C.K.: The only thing I see, Maria did everyone get a copy of this Wellness Program?

Maria Bucsanszky: Yes

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay no, no, all the employees.

Maria Bucsanszky: They'll be notified directly by their health plan about the Wellness Program within the next few weeks so they'll get separate notifications.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, can we just give a copy maybe to the union president and then this way he can talk about it at the union meeting because there is some incentive for them to participate in this Wellness Program.

Maria Bucsanszky: Sure.

Commissioner T.H.: Do you have an extra copy with you or you can use mine.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I guess we need dates for the 2014 Budget. Can we have dates that we're free?

Commissioner T.H.: What would be the best? How soon, let's put it that way, how soon should we start?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well we're going to need two or three right and unfortunately our meeting is not until the 6<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, so we'll have to meet before the 6<sup>th</sup> of November.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well you only got four weeks and then you figure that Thursday and Friday is out so what do you think Pat two or three.....

Commissioner P.K.: At least two or three I'm sure. If you don't mind we're going to need two or three if not more.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Right, so maybe we should have it on the 6<sup>th</sup> of this.....

Commissioner P.K.: I'll be out of town so they'll still be three of you if not four of you.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I'd rather have.....when are you coming back Pat?

Commissioner P.K.: Monday the 10<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner J.C.K.: That's a Sunday.

Commissioner P.K.: The 11<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, October or November you're talking about.

Commissioner P.K.: November.

Commissioner J.C.K.: How about.....when do you leave Pat?

Commissioner P.K.: The 1<sup>st</sup>. Hold on, I'm looking.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Why don't you take the month?

Commissioner P.K.: Alright, if you want me to. What are we looking at in December; what do you got in December?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well you got to have.....

Maria Bucsanszky: No, we have to have meeting before Thanksgiving.

Commissioner J.C.K.: You have to have it in before December.

Commissioner P.K.: Oh it has to be in before Thanksgiving?

Maria Bucsanszky: Yes.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Which then gives us two weeks.

Maria Bucsanszky: We have a conference on the 19<sup>th</sup> thru the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Commissioner P.K.: Do you want to do the 12<sup>th</sup>?

Commissioner J.C.K.: What about the.....would you be ready around the 28<sup>th</sup>?

Maria Bucsanszky: Of October?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes, we might try the first one on October 28<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner P.K.: That's fine with me.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Is that okay with you Mr. President?

Commissioner T.H.: Looks good for me.

Commissioner J.C.K.: And what about anything that week Pat?

Commissioner P.K.: I'm good all week; I have nothing until I leave the 1<sup>st</sup>.

Commissioner J.C.K.: You okay?

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner J.C.K.: So I guess you'll need to talk to Mr. Gardner and.....

Commissioner T.H.: I will speak will to Mr. Gardner and Commissioner Gould about the date of the 28<sup>th</sup>.....

Commissioner J.C.K.: 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner T.H. Well we'll tell him it's the 28<sup>th</sup> it starts with the first.....

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah, but I just want to make sure in case you need backups.

Commissioner T.H.: The 29<sup>th</sup> we can actually do it. I'll have to step out for a moment. We have a Relief Meeting but that wouldn't stop it.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, so let's leave it that way.

Commissioner T.H.: That's a good week up until Thursday and Friday.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, so let's go with that and at least it gets the first one in. We'll all be together to pick the other dates.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, very good, is there anything else?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Nope, that's all I have.

Commissioner P.K.: The interlocal agreement, we passed that already. We just have to sign that?

Commissioner T.H.: Yes, I signed it. Maria is going to send a legal agreement.

Commissioner P.K.: It's going to be signed.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Right, the only thing they did was modify the current interlocal agreement to include other stuff.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner J.C.K.: So really it's a more broad interlocal with the town to be able to do other activities here at the firehouse.



Commissioner T.H.: Okay, anything else under New Business for you?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Nope.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, Remarks, Comments and Questions from the Audience. The Chief's Report, is the chief here tonight?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Nope.

Commissioner T.H.: The chief is absent; all three of them. I'll take note of that, okay. In the absence of the chief we'll entertain Comments from the Audience.

**REMARKS, COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE:**

Commissioner T.H.: Local 290 President Keith Repace.

Keith Repace, President of Local 290: Thank you Mr. President, I have a few items. First of all I'd like to thank the Board for purchasing the GPS. I have another procedure or email downstairs that is at the watch desk if needed and at last month's meeting I noticed that the volunteer chief was back. What dates was he suspended from, from the volunteer fire company?

Commissioner T.H.: When did they suspend him?

Commissioner P.K.: He was suspended up until September 1<sup>st</sup> I think it was his first day back.

Keith Repace: Right, I believe he went out in February some time. I can get you the exact date for you. So he was suspended in August?

Commissioner J.C.K.: We don't know when. The volunteers just let us know that he was.....

(?): He was suspended I believe from the 8<sup>th</sup> of February until September 1<sup>st</sup> he was out of service.

Keith Repace: Okay, I'd like to give the Board of Fire Commissioners an article and will give you a couple of minutes to read that first.

Commissioner P.K.: Are we reading the trip to the Orioles game or?

Keith Repace: The top one.

Commissioner P.K.: Oh, okay.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, and your comment.

Keith Repace: Okay, if the volunteer chief is suspended in August how is he making comments on a fire that he wasn't at? Because there are two problems I have with what's here. One, two firefighters fell through the floor. That's the farthest thing from the truth and also the second thing was that the residents weren't home at the time of the fire. Again I guess we were contacting the media with the wrong information and now I want to know what the Board is going to do about it if anything.

Commissioner J.C.K.: May I answer the question?

Commissioner T.H.: You can answer, go ahead.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Did you speak to the reporter? Did the reporter say that they spoke to that person?

Keith Repace: I did not speak to the reporter but they do have comments that the chief said.

Commissioner P.K.: And the chief's name you don't know if he was the one that made the comments or not.

Commissioner T.H.: No you don't.

Commissioner P.K.: They have his name which anybody could get anyone of the chief's names just go to the website from the township fire district.

Keith Repace: Well it says according to Woodbridge Fire Chief Jason Ring.

Commissioner T.H.: We'll look into it. That's the best I can tell you. I have no idea who made the comments or whether they took his name off the website. I can't answer your question because I just don't know but I will look into it definitely.

Keith Repace: Okay, once again he's we'll allegedly say for now that's he's talking to the media and giving the media wrong information.

Commissioner T.H.: Well if he talked to the media let's leave it at that too because neither of us know if it was him. I see your point in bringing the article to our attention but I'm not going to jump to conclusions and assume that he was the person that the guy spoke to. We all know what happens when reporters interview people and then take the story back to the newspaper and it's entirely different than what we said so we will look into the matter and I'll let you know. Personally I will let you know. How's that?

Commissioner P.K.: He was the president of the fire company, let him look into it.

Commissioner T.H.: Yes, we'll do the same thing. Do you have another copy for Mr. Leminelle?

Keith Repace: No, we just slid one down to him.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Keith Repace: Also, another thing that I'd like to thank the Board for the oxygen bottles that were purchased and put on the apparatus and the cars and how much was the chief's car, does anybody know off the top of their head?

Commissioner P.K.: What, all done?

Keith Repace: Yeah, that's fine. A ballpark amount.

Commissioner P.K.: The car was \$28,000.00, outfitting is \$9,000.00.

Commissioner T.H.: Right.

(?): \$37,000.00.

Commissioner P.K.: Okay, thank you.

Keith Repace: Okay, so approximately \$37,000.00?

Commissioner T.H.: About.

Commissioner P.K.: Roundabout.

Keith Repace: And how come the chief's car, from the taxpayers of Woodbridge, how come the chief's car is in Port Reading Firehouse every Friday night?

Commissioner T.H.: You're bringing this to our attention or asking me why?

Keith Repace: Both.

Commissioner T.H.: On the first part you bringing it to my attention thank you, why, I have no idea. I'll look into that also. I was not aware of this. He's been spoken to and I will speak to him again about it.

Keith Repace: Okay, one last thing since the chief is back now is the Board of Fire Commissioners going to send the chief for retraining on sensitivity that the entire department went through since the volunteers apparently did what the paid had to do. Now the Board of Fire Commissioners are going to send them for training.

Commissioner T.H.: At this point?

Keith Repace: Yes.

Commissioner T.H.: I had no interest in doing so but believe there's an election coming up for the volunteers and he'll probably be leaving office and we did leave it at that.

Commissioner P.K.: On that one I'd say we're probably going to retrain everybody again next year so we'd probably just reconvene everybody next year to do it. To pay that one individual for training would be outrageous so we will get (inaudible) into the other one and we can ask him if he's had sensitivity training at his job because he might have gotten it there too like another firefighter has received before.

Keith Repace: Okay thank you that's all I have for right now.

Commissioner T.H.: Alright, does anybody else here have any questions? Any comments? Hear none I'll entertain a motion for adjournment.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I'll make a motion.

Commissioner T.H.: Excuse me, there's one thing I forgot. I would ask our attorney, Mr. Howell, if you will report on the status of the contract between this department and Campbell Supply with the engines for the record.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: The above contract is finalized in its final form and signed by the Board at the last meeting. I presented that following the meeting to Campbell Supply for their signature. They have yet to sign it but I have been in communication with Campbell and everything is fine it's just that it's taking some time to get that signed. I've also communicated with them about the trade-in on the two pumpers. We've been given a trade-in value. I relayed to them that the pumpers have been recently certificated so that might have some increased value and they're going to come back to me with a new proposal on what kind of trade we might get for the existing pumpers. I hope to be getting a hold of that by the end of this week or early next week.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for that report. Now I'll entertain a motion for adjournment.

Commissioner John C. Kenny made a motion to adjourn the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously at 7:22 P.M.
