

**Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Wednesday, April 2, 2014 at 7:00 P.M.**

Commissioner Todd Howell called the meeting to order.

Maria Bucsanszky: Mr. President – All the requirements of the “Open Public Meeting Act” have been complied with by advertising in the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger. Copies of the meeting notice have been sent to the Municipal Clerk’s Office and posted on the bulletin boards of the fire house and the post offices of Woodbridge and Sewaren. Mr. President, you may proceed.

Commissioner Todd Howell led a pledge to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed for our departed members and all our troops throughout the entire world.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**PERSONNEL:**

Commissioner T.H.: There are no problems in the Personnel Committee whatsoever.

**EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES:**

Commissioner T.H.: I’ll report that at this time we’re making arrangements for the annual pump tests, the aerial tests, hose tests and the ground ladder tests on those pieces of apparatus which it is necessary to do it for. Equipment for Portables – Commissioner John Kenny.

**EQUIPMENT FOR PORTABLES:**

Commissioner J.C.K.: Portable equipment, Mr. President, Firefighter Hilliard’s gear should be in on April 11<sup>th</sup> and I understand that Firefighter Genser got his boots and else wise I do not know of any outstanding issues with portable equipment except today we had a forty-five hundred bottle that looks like it has a problem with the threads that they’re going to look at.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for the report. Buildings and Grounds –  
Commissioner Gardner.

**BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:**

Commissioner K.G.: Thank you Mr. President. As you all know I guess the back roof was completed by Penyak; it looks like a good job. We're just now waiting for the township to.....I see our Councilwoman is here this evening. If she could just keep an eye on that for us we're waiting for the township insurance consultant that's been looking at all of the town buildings since the hurricane and the firehouse was part of that so we're waiting for their final report to see if they can help us with any more of the repairs that need to be done but the roof is doing well. We do still have a problem in the front which again Commissioner Howell has told me that has existed probably since the building was built so we're going to..... without objection from the Board I'm going to talk to Mr. Brower and have him see if he can design some changes to the front valley of that roof and we'll try to do that in conjunction with what happens with the township insurance consultant so that we can permanently fix it and avoid any further leaks into the dorm. As you know we've done extensive work to get rid of mold problems and then just did some work with the new bathroom in the dorm as well as painting and putting new beds so we certainly want to protect our investment. So if the Board doesn't have any objection I'll talk to Mr. Brower and that will be under a professional service contract of course. If were to move forward to pay him any substantial amount of money I would bring that back to the Board.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for your report.

Commissioner K.G.: That's it on that. The next item is the air conditioner in the radio room. The unit cost us quite a bit in repairs and it seemed as if there are no longer any repairs that will make it work. I reached out to several contractors. We first reached out to AirTec that is our regular air conditioning servicing unit. They submitted a bid of \$6,900.00 even. I also received a bid from Carrier. Their bid is \$7,440.00. I reached out to another firm from Linden at 3351 Tremley Point Road. I think the company is Aggreko. Unfortunately they could not help us but we did reach out to them. We also reached out to Bergen Refrigeration and Air Conditioning in Clifton, phone number (973)779-9977. I placed two phone calls. I then was told that I'd receive an email from the owner and manager to get some more information although I had already provided all the information I did for the other two firms. I have not received any response and the last people that we reached out to was a commercial distributors air conditions phone number (908)515-5237. There was no response there as well so having said that I suggest that we go with the low bid from AirTec of \$6,900.00 and again I talked to Patrick about that. Because of the sensitivity with the radios we feel the a ceiling unit is the best there so it's up out of the way and doesn't take up any of the wall space should we need any other further work or expansion there was well. So I'll put that in the form of a motion.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to go with the low bid of AirTec of \$6,900.00 to repair the air condition in the radio room which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny which was carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: You'll notify them Ken?

Commissioner K.G.: I'll make the happy phone call. That's all I have for Buildings and Grounds although I may come back with something later.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, Purchasing – Commissioner Gardner..

### **PURCHASING:**

Commissioner K.G.: Standard purchasing Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you, Fire Prevention – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

### **FIRE PREVENTION:**

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, we have a couple of things. The Fire Prevention Bureau met with the Seniors Club up at the Community Center. They discussed general fire safety issues around the house including the proper use of fire extinguishers. They offered their services to the club regarding home inspections however a lot of people didn't live in Woodbridge. They did tell them to reach out to their local departments to see if they do anything like that for each of the fire departments if needed. They conducted one home safety inspection out of the class which was approximately seventy people at the class and the Fire Prevention Bureau is working on a few possible arson fires with the police department including the one in Port Reading. In your packets you're see that there is a letter from the person that they did the home inspection. It's a very nice letter. As we've always said and I'm trying to go with the J.C. Kenny's things to try to get out to the public to do home inspections to get smoke detectors in and try to get into people's heads so it gives them a better chance to get out during a fire. We're reaching out everywhere we can to try to make it known to everybody. Through the Bureau the car was delivered and will be going for paint in the next couple of weeks, under New Business I have that. That's really all I have right now.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for your report Commissioner Kenny. Radios and Hydrants – once again Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

### **RADIOS AND HYDRANTS:**

Commissioner P.K.: All of our radios and hydrants are up and running. The pagers were sent out to Allen Radio. The speakers were done today. Soon as they look at those and if there are any of those that are fixable they will fix them and get the back

to us. If they are unrepairable they'll let me know that too so that we can order some more to replace the ones that we need if we need them.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you, Safety Committee – Commissioner Gardner.

**SAFETY:**

Commissioner K.G.: Progress Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: And also Liaison To The Volunteer Fire Company – once again Commissioner Gardner.

**LIAISON TO THE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY:**

Commissioner K.G.: I don't think we have anything there at this time Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you At this time I'll entertain from our clerk the Report of Payroll and Bills.

**The report of Payroll and Bills for March, 2014:**

Commissioner T.H.: I also have the following add-on bills. The total add-on bills come to \$743.82 along with the ones that the clerk read. I'll entertain a motion for all payroll and bills as read.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Payroll and Bills and the add-on bills for the month of March, 2014 which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Treasurer's Report.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as read which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kennedy and carried unanimously.

Commissioner T.H.: Communications.

**COMMUNICATIONS:**

Maria Bucsanszky: All communications have been passed on to the commissioners.

Commissioner T.H.: Under Communications I was handed this letter just prior to the meeting. I will read it. It's addressed to me as the president of the Board of Fire Commissioners and fellow Fire Commissioners. Dear President Howell and Fellow Commissioners. After forty-two years of service in the Woodbridge Fire Department it is with a heavy heart that I respectfully tender my letter of resignation from the Woodbridge Fire Department Board of Fire Commissioners. Serving as a volunteer fireman as well as commissioner for the department has been one of the most rewarding accomplishments of my career. The professional and personal friendships made within my tenor are among the best of any association I'd ever been part of. I am especially proud of our department as it has achieved a great amount of aid and professional service to the community it serves. I would like to thank my fellow members of the Board of Fire Commissioners for their diligent service, professionalism and friendship throughout the years. I would also like to thank the members of the Bureau of Fire Prevention. It was a pleasure to work with you and appreciate your commitment to protect our community. To all members of the department I wish you continued success and good health as you bravely serve your department. Sincerely, Richard T. Gould. I'll entertain a motion to accept this with regret and wishes to Mr. Gould for his future.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to accept with regret Mr. Gould's resignation from the Board of Fire Commissioners which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Mr. President, I'd like to make a motion that Commissioner Gould has given a lifetime whether it was with the volunteers or up here with the Board and he has been very instrumental in many of our successful projects that he had taken on and I think the for all those years of dedication we really should get him some type of plaque or something to recognize all the years of services that he has provided.

Commissioner T.H.: I agree with you and I'm sure that the rest of the Board does. I'll ask the President of the Fire Company, Mr. Leminielle if you would assist me on that to get an appropriate plaque that we can present to Mr. Gould. Thank you very much for your thoughts. That's a very good idea. This can be turned over to the clerk.

Commissioner K.G.: Mr. President. I just was caught off guard by this as I guess you were when you got the letter tonight. Rich has missed a few meetings but has put an incredible amount of time into the district over the years and I just want to thank him for his service and apologize for not having more to say. I'm just caught off guard but well wishes to Rich and we'll make sure we do that.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I agree with you one hundred percent.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for your comments.

Commissioner P.K.: I concur too Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: And so do I. I think he was a fine man, he served the district very well and I wish him well in his future. Alright, thank you for your comments under Communications. Are there any others? That's it I believe. Unfinished Business – does anyone have Unfinished Business starting with Patrick on my left..

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, I received a letter from the union in reference to the status for the Fire Prevention list posting that we did back in January but right now until we get some personnel issues straightened out I'm going to put a hold on that until such time I think we can come back to it after we get some things straightened out with personnel. That's all I have under Unfinished Business.

Commissioner T.H.: Commissioner John Kenny, do you have anything under.....

Commissioner J.C.K.: The only thing I have under Unfinished Business was I did, I guess we all did, receive a letter from the clerk who is the administrator of the LOSAP program and he's saying that he has reviewed and audited the records and that as per the way the resolution is written to the public which they voted on that all qualify. So with that I think Saturday morning would be the thirty days so if there are no petitions then I would ask that the clerk's office have a go ahead and distribute the funds.

Commissioner T.H.: Motion that they distribute the funds as per the letter that we receive from the clerk.

Commissioner John C. Kenny made a motion to distribute the funds as per the letter from the clerk which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously except for a comment and a no vote for the two members that were suspended for six months from Commissioner Ken Gardner and Commissioner John C. Kenny voting for everyone but himself.

Commissioner K.G.: I have a comment. First off I think it's traditional that none of us would vote on our own a portion of it that's required at this point I abstain on my own. Secondly it came up during the discussion that two of the members that are listed on the list, and I won't mention the names, but there are two members that have been listed that were suspended from the fire company for six months although the calculations were done correctly by the secretary of the company as was confirmed by the clerk. I can't in good conscience vote to give public funds to members that have been suspended for six months so I'll vote no on those two members.

Commissioner T.H.: Any other comments?

Commissioner K.G.: That's it.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I vote for everyone but myself.

Commissioner T.H.: Alright, let's reword that motion. All those who wish to vote for this motion without considering themselves which would include myself and Patrick.....

Commissioner P.K.: Not me.

Commissioner T.H.: That's right you're not on the list, excuse me.

Commissioner P.K.: I'm not on the list.

Commission John C. Kenny made a motion to distribute the funds as per the letter from the clerk which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously with the exceptions of themselves except for Commissioner Patrick Kenny who was not on the list and Commissioner Ken Gardner voting no for the two members that were suspended for six months..

Commissioner K.G.: Again Mr. President I'll abstain myself and vote no on the two and yes on the others.

Commissioner T.H.: Is there anything else on Unfinished Business? Jack do you have anything?

Commissioner J.C.K.: No.

Commissioner T.H.: Commissioner Gardner.

Commissioner K.G.: No Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: Alright, New Business – Commissioner Patrick Kenny.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, I'd like to make a motion for Heavenly Body Works in the amount of \$2,500.00 to paint the new Fire Prevention vehicle beet red. It'll match the new apparatus now that will be coming in, in the summer. I'd like to make a motion to go with Heavenly to paint that vehicle.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion for Heavenly Body Works to paint the new Fire Prevention vehicle in the amount of \$2,500.00 which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner P.K.: The other thing I have is at the Executive Session I'd like to talk about the National Fire Academy with the Board.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner P.K.: I have some career department looking to go and I want to the talk to the Board about it.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay, one other item is that under New Business I'll just report under New Business that we received a draft from the Director of the Audit Division of the State Comptroller's Office and at this time the Board of Fire Commissioners, our attorney and our clerk are drafting a response and that response will be formulated some time in this coming month and sent out and then we'll report on it at the next meeting and that's it on that particular item. Does anybody else have anything under New Business they wish to bring up?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Under New Business Mr. President I have some good news. The township, through their consultant, took our SREC that we had in the bank and we're now in the market to bid that and I'm happy to say that we were able to get a hundred and sixty-three dollars in SREC for our banks SRECs. They went on competitive pricing. They were low at sixty and we did get up to a hundred and sixty-three. We will be getting a check directly from.....I think the company that was awarded was PSEG Trading Enterprises which I have no affiliation nor did I have anything to do with the bids and we will be getting a check directly for fifteen thousand dollars for those SRECs.

Commissioner T.H.: Very good. Thank you for that good news.

Commissioner K.G.: That's just related to the solar panels, right?



Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes.

Commissioner T.H.: Is there anything else you have under New Business?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Nope.

Commissioner T.H.: Commissioner Kenny. Excuse me, Commissioner Gardner.

Commissioner K.G.: Can't beat that Mr. President.

Commissioner T.H.: No, it's very hard to top that good news, very good. At this time I'll entertain Remarks, Comments and Questions From The Audience. We'll start out with our Chief's Report, Chief Michael Hapstak.

### **CHIEF'S REPORT:**

Chief Hapstak: I apologize again. I don't have a report from the Fire Prevention on calls this month. That's the second time this year. However I'd like to request the ladder truck for May 17<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 P.M. There's a hockey game which has been going on for the past two years between police, EMS and fire. We put the ladder up to hang the flag. We did it last year and with your permission we'd like to do it again. I'm asking early so we can get ourselves....it is our town so I'd like to do that again at 3:00 P.M. and it's going to last a couple of hours.

Commissioner T.H.: Fine.

Commissioner J.C.K.: That's great.

Commissioner K.G.: You're going to take care of that Mr. President?

Commissioner T.H.: Fine, I'll see to it that the people are notified.

Chief Hapstak: That's it.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you for the report Chief. Are there any other comments from anyone in the audience?

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, I'll touch base with Fire Prevention to find out where the reports are. I know Lisa is out ill this week right now, she hasn't been in this week but I'll find out where it's been for the last month or so.

Commissioner T.H.: Thank you. Anybody else in the audience care to make any comments? At this time we'll go into Executive Section.

Commissioner Ken Gardner made a motion to go into Executive Session at 7:21 P.M. to talk about legal and personnel matters which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

(Tape issue) – Attorney Christopher Howell announced that the following items were discussed in executive session: Training Criteria; Firefighter Test Point System; Employee #2412 – Peter Reilly – As advised by labor counsel, Eric Bernstein – District will apply for Involuntary Disability Retirement; Employee #1401 – Board will hire Thomas Randall as new Hearing Officer to review disciplinary matter. Due to Doctrine of Necessity – all Board members will need to vote on the hiring of Thomas Randall; Officers' meeting – Standard Operating Guidelines, duties and responsibilities of Officers' and training were reviewed.

Comm. John C. Kenny read resolution No. 2014-402 Authorizing the Woodbridge Township Fire District #1 to pursue an application for involuntary disability retirement on Peter Reilly's behalf. (Resolution attached). Motion to accept resolution made by Comm. Patrick Kenny, seconded by Comm. Gardner – Roll Call Vote – Comm. Gardner, Comm. Howell, Comm. John C. Kenny, Comm. Patrick Kenny – Yes - All in Favor.

Motion to hire Thomas Randall as new hearing officer for disciplinary matter with Employee #1401 made by Comm. Patrick Kenny, seconded by Comm. Gardner, all in Favor.

Comm. Patrick Kenny requested a motion to authorize the Board President to sign the contract with Hopelawn Fire District #8 for used Pierce Fire Pumper once Board attorney has reviewed contract, seconded by Comm. John C. Kenny, All in Favor.

Comm. Patrick Kenny requested the District Clerk to begin paperwork to promote 3 employees to Provisional Fire Prevention Specialist UFD pending State approvals.

Comm. Gardner addressed Lt. Keith Repace – Woodbridge Senior Group sent a very complimentary letter to the Board concerning fire safety training received – Comm. Gardner stated excellent job – and Comm. Patrick Kenny requested that a copy of the letter be placed in Lt. Keith Repace's and FI. Thomas McNamara's personnel file.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to adjourn the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner John C. Kenny and carried unanimously at 9:50 P.M.

DISTRICT #1 TO PURSUE AN APPLICATION FOR  
INVOLUNTARY DISABILITY RETIREMENT ON PETER  
REILLY'S BEHALF

WHEREAS, Firefighter Peter Reilly suffered a knee injury in August 2013; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of that injury, Firefighter Peter Reilly has been unable to return to full duty; and,

WHEREAS, the Township has medical reports from at least two (2) sources stating that Firefighter Peter Reilly will be permanently restricted in his physical activities, which restrictions will permanently preclude Firefighter Peter Reilly from returning to full duty; and,

WHEREAS, the Township is of the opinion that Firefighter Peter Reilly is totally and permanently disabled from fulfilling his job duties as Firefighter for Woodbridge Township Fire District #1; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Woodbridge Township Fire District #1 Board of Fire Commissioners, Township of Woodbridge, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey that the District Clerk and the Board's Labor Counsel be and are hereby authorized to pursue an involuntary disability retirement application on behalf of the Woodbridge Township Fire District #1 for Firefighter Peter Reilly.
