

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Wednesday, April 1, 2015 at 7:00 P.M.

Commissioner P.K.: I just want to congratulate both of you. They had a good career here and it's going to be even better now as you move up to the ranks to replace the guys that were in front of you and have left now to go onto bigger and better things.

Commissioner K.G.: I just want to say it's nice to see the retirees here. I'm sorry nobody picked up Fitz along the way but it's good to see you guys still love the place.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Alright, we're going to go into our regular part of the meeting. If you want to stay you're more than welcome or if you would like to move on and enjoy the night go to it. Okay, we'll get into the rest of the meeting here. We'll start with Committees – Personnel. Commissioner Kenny do you have anything for Commissioner Howell?

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PERSONNEL:

Commissioner P.K.: We had a couple of firefighters that were out hurt. They are back now so shifts are back up to where they should be and the training is in progress for the seven new hires with the training captain. That's all I have under Personnel.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, for Equipment – Commissioner Kenny.

EQUIPMENT - VEHICLES:

Commissioner P.K.: If everybody doesn't know Engine 9 the alternator went on it. It's been repaired. The two new engines will be arriving tomorrow between 9:00 A.M. and 9:30 A.M. here. We'll be switching over the hose from both engines and the equipment and mounting things. The training is scheduled to start on Monday for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of next week. As the guys are training if they're comfortable with it the piece will go in service that night. Once they're here tomorrow we'll get the titles and we'll try to get the plates for them so this way over the days of the shifts the guys can actually take them out and do a little driver training on the road. They're very simple. It's not too much different than anything else that we have there. That's really all we have under Equipment at this time. Sorry, the two old ones will be leaving tomorrow and going with the representatives from the sale's people and we will be going off mutual aid chief just so you know from tomorrow until after each training session next week and by next Thursday we should be back on full mutual aid for everything. They're not going to train until Monday so Monday night we'll go back on mutual aid, come back off Tuesday morning, back on Tuesday night, off Wednesday, back Wednesday night, off Thursday. I did see Mac Warren, mutual aid coordinator, at the meeting the other day and I explained that to him and they're well aware of that too that what we're going to be doing.

Chief Brian Fee: What's the status on the truck?

Commissioner P.K.: The truck is up and running right now as far as I know. Nobody told me differently.

Chief Brian Fee: Alright.

Commissioner P.K.: Just a couple of little backups they're waiting on parts but for the most part everything is up and running. Everybody has been taught if the light doesn't go where it should go that center was ordered and I believe it was put in already too. Okay?

Chief Brian Fee: Alright, thank you.

Commissioner P.K.: That's all I have sir under Equipment.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, anybody have any questions for Equipment?

EQUIPMENT - PORTABLES:

Commissioner J.C.K.: Under Portable – Equipment batteries have been ordered for the camera and next month I'll come with a proposal for the air packs for this year's to continue with the replacement of the air packs in the bottles so I'll bring that up at next month's meeting. That was all I had going on for Portable – Equipment. Anybody got any questions for Portable – Equipment? Okay, House – Commissioner Gardner.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:

Commissioner K.G.: Thank you Mr. President, two items. Just to give an update we had the company reinstalling the solar panels so the roof itself has been completed. They're now in the process of reconnecting and getting the solar panels back into shape. Once they're put on then they'll put the snow guards...they actually get attached to the solar panels and after that we have a little bit of gutter replacement or repairs to do. I don't know if we're going to need a full replacement. We'll know better after the other work is completed. The other item is we have a quote from Mike Bilyak, our electrician to install a key pad on the rear door for \$2,346.00 and that's to update all the necessary equipment with that as well so....

Commissioner John C. Kenny made a motion to install a key pad on the rear door which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner K.G.: And that's it. You know the roof has been good. It hasn't leaked so after we get a little bit under our belt there then we'll take care of some of the other repairs along that line.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for Building? Okay, we will go into Purchasing – Commissioner Gardner.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for Fire Prevention report? Hydrants and Radios – Commissioner Minkler.

Area Fire Equipment for Training; TASK Fire Apparatus, Inc.; Cannon USA, Inc.; Comcast; Elizabethtown Gas; Maryann Sofka, Middlesex County Prevention Protective Association; New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission; PATH Fire Apparatus, Inc.; Star Ledger; Winsair Public Safety Group; Joseph Karnas; Spartan ERV. All those bills total in the amount of \$1,136,421.00. I'd like to make a motion to pay the add-on bills.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to pay the add-on bills which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Any questions.

Commissioner K.G.: Yes Mr. President. We are having an Executive Session to discuss the new engines, right?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yup.

Commissioner K.G.: Okay, we'll hold this now and just pending that discussion.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, anything else?

Commissioner R.M.: New Business – I should have reported this under Hydrants. Beginning April 1st they're going to be inspecting the hydrants, Middlesex Water Company this year, and in 2016 they will be flushing them.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, anything else?

Commissioner R.M.: That's it sir.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Commissioner Gardner.

Commissioner K.G.: Nothing Mr. President.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Mr. Attorney.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Madame Clerk.

Maria Bucsanszky: Nothing.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, just to give an update under training. I got a report that during the first quarter they've been working on ICS 300 and 400. This past month there was a dry run of the new RIT pack with the pack finder in the firehouse and then they went out to the Middlesex County Fire Academy and did hands on. It was very good I understand and very much different than trying to do it in the backroom when you're using the smoke. No heat but even with just the smoke itself it was a very good learning experience was the feedback on that. The volunteer department will be going to the Middlesex County Fire Academy for a live burn on May 14th at 7:30 P.M. We'll be holding a new pump class for the new firefighters and any current firefighters who need to take the course also. The new firefighters are progressing well. They're split into two groups. Everyone is doing well and learning the equipment and how our standard procedures are working on and we're going to be switching the groups coming up on April 20th and once the training is done three members currently in Fire Prevention will be back down for a short refresher. We also made an agreement with Middlesex County Fire Academy to put wood that was in Bay 1. They took that and they're going to give us credit towards future training classes so that's all I have under that. Okay, we will go to Remarks, Comments and Questions from the Audience and we will start with the Chief's Report.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to go into Executive Session for personnel and legal matters at 7:20 P.M which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to return to the regular meeting at 7:55 P.M. which was seconded by Commissioner Ken Gardner and carried unanimously.


Commissioner J.C.K.: Mr. Attorney, do you want to advise the public.
