

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Wednesday, June 3, 2015 at 7:00 P.M.

Commissioner John C. Kenny called the meeting to order.

Maria Bucsanszky: Mr. President – All the requirements of the “Open Public Meeting Act” have been complied with by advertising in the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger. Copies of the meeting notice have been sent to the Municipal Clerk’s Office and posted on the bulletin boards of the fire house and the post offices of Woodbridge and Sewaren. Mr. President, you may proceed.

Commissioner John C. Kenny led a pledge to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed for our departed members and for our men and women serving overseas.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to approve the May 6, 2015 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously except for Commissioner Pat Kenny abstaining because he was not at the previous meeting.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, we’ll go into the Committee Reports. Personnel – Commissioner Howell.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PERSONNEL:

Commissioner T.H.: Under Personnel I just report that the training program is preceding and the men have been coming to work very regularly, we’ll leave it at that. End of report.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for the Personnel? Okay, Equipment – Commissioner Patrick Kenny

EQUIPMENT - VEHICLES:

Commissioner P.K.: The two new engines are working good. There are some small things that they are finding wrong that are getting fixed under warrantee. The ladder truck has started to get it’s pm in the building. It started Monday and Tuesday and

today and should be finished by Friday with that. Tomorrow it will up in the mall to do ladder and the rest of the chassis moved while the hose testing is taking place. With the new procedure doing it this way the ladder truck is taken out of service in the morning, the man works on it all day and then when he leaves it goes back in service so it's not sitting somewhere for three weeks and this way once we get the list of what other things that need to be done then we'll address that with the reps from the company that repair it. That's all I have right now. I'm actually working on getting an estimate for Engine 3 to get some of the bodywork done and repainted. Hopefully I will have that for the July meeting or if we have to go out for bidding I'll have the bids ready to go through the town to go out for bid on it. That's all I have under Equipment.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for the Equipment?

Commissioner T.H.: No.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, next report would be Portable Equipment.

EQUIPMENT - PORTABLES:

Commissioner J.C.K.: Everything is moving along. I'm going to be working on getting the air pack order in and else wise I don't know of anything earth shattering out there if anybody knows of anything. Okay, House – Commissioner Kenny.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:

Commissioner P.K.: The roof is done but now there is another leak that might have appeared. I'm going to leave it over to Commissioner Gardner to look into it. Other than that we are status quo.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for the House? Purchasing – Commissioner Minkler

PURCHASING:

Commissioner R.M.: Normal purchasing for the month sir.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Very good, you learned that quick. Fire Prevention – Commissioner Minkler.

FIRE PREVENTION:

Commissioner R.M.: Yes Mr. President. Report dated June 3rd, 2015 report covering May, 2015. Fire Investigations – 1 Total inspections completed in May – 55; Spot inspections – 1; Life hazard uses – 10; Non-Life hazard uses – 45; Total reinspections – 111; Total amount billed in May - \$1,417.00; Total amount collected

- \$6,875.00. Three Fire Prevention classes attended after the Fire Prevention at the Woodbridge High School. That's my report.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for the Fire Prevention? Hydrants and Radios – Commissioner Minkler.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Safety – Commissioner Howell.

Commissioner T.H.: Progress.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Liaison To The Volunteer Fire Company – Commissioner Howell.

LIAISON TO THE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY:

Commissioner T.H.: Well in the absence of Commissioner Gardner who would normally take care of this I will report that we have progress. No problems within the volunteers at this time.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for that? Report of Payroll and Bills.

The report of Payroll and Bills for May, 2015:

Commissioner T.H.: I'll make a motion that we pay those bills plus these add-ons which I will read. Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes.

Commissioner P.K.: I have one more add-on for Pinnacle Wireless for reprogramming of the radios for \$750.00. They reprogrammed all the radios and installed the ones on the (inaudible).

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions on the bills?

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to accept the Payroll and Bills plus the add-on bills for the month of May, 2015 which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously except for Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. abstaining on Voucher 114, 14403 and 14386 and yes on all the others.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Treasurer's Report.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Unfinished Business – Commissioner Kenny.

Commissioner P.K.: None at this time.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Commissioner Minkler.

Commissioner R.M.: None at this time

Commissioner J.C.K.: Commissioner Howell.

Commissioner T.H.: None.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Madame Clerk.

Maria Bucsanszky: None.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Mr. Attorney.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: Mr. President the only thing I can report on would be the sale of the Class Pumper Engine #10. Still negotiating the truck communiqué with Campbell Supply. We have a title issue. We're still waiting for final payment on that and I just don't have the indication of the exact date when that will happen. Engine 9 is already sold and the title transferred. Engine 10 still remains open and we haven't received final payment of \$71,250.00 as agreed upon. So I'll continue with that and let the Board know where we stand on that once I hear back from Campbell Supply.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, under Unfinished Business the surveyors were supposed to come out May 19th to survey the property. I'll give them a call tomorrow and found out if that happened and.....

Commissioner T.H.: There's a bill in there for them.

Maria Bucsanszky: The check is in there.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Is there?

Commissioner T.H.: Yes.

Commissioner J.C.K.: But we still haven't gotten the survey itself yet, right?

Maria Bucsanszky: Right.

Commissioner T.H.: No.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, New Business -- Commissioner Kenny.

NEW BUSINESS:

Commissioner P.K.: None at this time, maybe after we come out of Executive Session.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Commissioner Minkler.

Commissioner R.M.: None at this time sir.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Commissioner Howell.

Commissioner T.H.: No I have none at this time.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Madame Clerk.

Maria Bucsansky: None at this time.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Mr. Attorney.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: None sir.

Commissioner T.H.: Don't we have to approve those issues?

Maria Bucsanszky: Do you want to bring that up that change in the firm?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes.

Commissioner T.H.: Okay.

Commissioner J.C.K.: So I think there's going to be a change in the firm right?

Maria Bucsanszky: Effective July 1st the accounting firm that will be handling the fire district will be changed from Casazza and Ur to Maria Bucsanszky, BA and the (inaudible) will be LLC.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay.

Commissioner T.H.: I make a motion we adopt that.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to adopt the new accounting firm to be handling the fire district as Maria Bucsanszky, BA as of July 1st, 2015 which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I mean that's fine. I mean we actually have her but she's just listed with a different firm so it's just changing the firm that she was listed under. Okay, congratulations.

Commissioner T.H.: LOSAP

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, so we got that. The two items is that in Executive?

Commissioner R.M.: Yeah.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, alright. I was reading this report I guess that happened today. Maybe in the future maybe when we're doing any type of exercises out on School Street that we just put cones out at Brook and cones out at East Park and just cone off the area.

Commissioner P.K.: On School Street?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah.

Commissioner P.K.: What are you going to do with the traffic trying to get to the schools and Board of Ed then?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well they'll have to come around and come up here to Brook.

Commissioner P.K.: Maybe we should relocate to another area where there is no traffic coming around.

Commissioner R.M.: They did.

Commissioner P.K.: Or try to stay out of the way or just put cones along where our hose is where it's off to the side of the road because once you start closing roads down....

Commissioner T.H.: I think you're going to have a problem.

Commissioner P.K.: If you want to talk about it more we'll talk about it more later in Executive or whatever you want but you got to watch what you're going to do.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well I'm just saying that....you see what happened here today and this was all the way over by East Park Avenue.

Commissioner P.K.: Was it in the little...on the (inaudible) there?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah.

Commissioner P.K.: You could have closed that off. You know what I'm saying? You could have closed off the triangle where we set the ladder truck up, where we do the ladder thing. You can close that off and the cars can still come down East Park to School Street.

Commissioner J.C.K.: So what you're saying is if you're hooked to the hydrant maybe you can cone down the street into one lane.

Commissioner P.K.: Somebody have the email so I can read it?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah.

Commissioner P.K.: And see what it says because Todd read it to me but I never got it.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah, it's around here.

Commissioner P.K.: Yeah to the fire account which I can't get into. Right on School Street by the hydrant by the park by the monument. The hose was approximately three inches from the curb. A woman driving a white two door car drove over the uncharged hose and dragged it approximately one to two feet. She stopped and got out of the car and said what was that?

Commissioner J.C.K.: That's what happened.

Commissioner P.K.: If you put cones along where the hose is on the outside of the cone...

Commissioner J.C.K.: Right.

Commissioner P.K.: Instead of closing the whole road off you should do that.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah that's what I just said.

Commissioner P.K.: No you said close it off.

Commissioner J.C.K.: First I said close it off and then I just said cone by the piece that's tied to the hydrant and then cone along the hose. It'll shrink the road down to one lane...

Commissioner P.K.: There are about twenty cones downstairs that the town has given to the fire department.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, I'll put something out for that. Okay, that's that.

Commissioner P.K.: And that too I know we like to be close but even doing that if we wanted to maybe in that big parking lot up at the mall we just close off some of those driveways there and you could still lay the line and shoot the water into the parking lot.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Well the problem is is that sometimes when we're training they are tied to the hydrant they'll abandon what's there and they'll make sure that they still have apparatus to respond.

Commissioner P.K.: So I'm saying that too. There's a hydrant up there that they can hook up to right at the mall in the parking lot.

Commissioner J.C.K.: But then you'd be leaving that pumper abandoned in the mall parking lot.

Commissioner P.K.: Okay.

Commissioner R.M.: They were training up in the park and some people complained that they didn't think it was appropriate them training there or something with the water so that's way they stopped training up there. We were doing that a few years ago.

Commissioner P.K.: They were sucking the houses dry of water.

Commissioner T.H.: Yeah.

Commissioner R.M.: It was a good spot up there. We were out of the way. Nobody bothered you.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, well we'll try this and see how this works first.

Commissioner T.H.: Additional cones is a better idea.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yeah, okay. Just for the May training report total training hours for the month of May were four hundred and thirty-four hours. Three hundred and ninety-six hours were for the career and thirty-eight hours for the volunteer department. Training for the new firefighters continue through May. Training was a celebrated loll for this group because of their time in Fire Prevention and better weather. They started to assist and process according to NFPA1002 standards. All the new firefighters complete a cone and road course at the end of May and will have completed the rest of their assessment by the second week in June. We will continue to have the obstacle of apparatus being in and out during the training has hampered with the program but they're working around it. During the month of May both the career and volunteer members took part in live burns down at the fire academy and also drilled on the RIT pack on the pack finder while down there. Currently we have six firefighters applying for Level Two with four having received their certification. Sixteen applied for Level Three and eight have received their certifications. In looking through the files we've noticed that some of the members do not have any IML levels in their training files. We're trying to work through the state to find an easier way for them to apply for these at this time. There was a total of five who applied for all three levels with two having received their certifications. I sent an email reminding all members that received their three hundreds and four hundreds to please see Lisa to help fill out the application form for their IML certification. I contacted St. Barnabas about putting the program in the fire department and hope to have this program by June. This is requested by some of the employees after the fire

on the New Jersey Turnpike. I continue to assist Lisa who has been very valuable in helping keeping the training program moving in the right direction. That's all I have for the training report from May. Any questions? And the other thing I guess Commissioner Kenny you're working on this recall?

Commissioner P.K.: Yup, I just got that today.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay.

Commissioner P.K.: I'll get it down.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Got it. That takes care of that and then we'll move to Remarks, Comments and Questions From the Audience and we will start with the Chief's report. Chief Hilliard.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

Commissioner J.C.K.: Chief, have you requested any equipment or anything?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, alright. Then if you guys are please get in touch with Commissioner Kenny or Commissioner Howell about that.

Commissioner T.H.: Let me know.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Any other Remarks or Comments from the Audience?

Keith Repace, President of Local 290: I'd like to thank the Board of Fire Commissioners for allowing the shifts to attend the Fire Prevention class at Woodbridge High School after a fire. As I reported in the last meeting it was the two Seton Hall survivors and Commissioner Howell was there. It was a very touching and somber and educational piece and the union is looking to sponsor that again in

January of next year. I just want to thank the Board for allowing the shift to go up there.

Commissioner J.C.K.: No problem.

Keith Repace: If you can make it it's well worth it.

Commissioner T.H.: While we're entertaining comments I'd just like to say that I want to compliment our attorney who turned himself into a firefighter when the house across the street from him caught on fire in the middle of the night and he was able to run out of his home using the experience that I have that he doesn't have and he mustarded his neighbors together to put an effective garden hose stream on the fire and just hold it until the fire department arrived which took quite a while up there. But I just want it noted that he did pick up a little bit about fire fighting and I want to compliment him on it.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: Thank you.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Congratulations.

Commissioner T.H.: Yeah, he did a good job.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Good job. I just have one other thing I forgot you're going to see that on Brook Street on the apartment side it says now permit parking or resident parking there. Chief if you want you can talk to me afterwards but that's to enhance the capable of making sure that we have parking available for us in this area here so don't be alarmed. Anybody else got anything else? Okay I think we need a motion to go into Executive Session in regards to some personnel matters and also for legal matters.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to go into Executive Session in regards to some personnel matters and legal matters at 7:23 P.M which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to return to the regular meeting at 8:54 P.M. which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Does anyone got anything else to bring in front of the Board?

Commissioner P.K.: Mr. President, I'd like to make a motion that we appoint Michael Barcellona, Michael Geiger and Keith McGrath to Firefighter Prevention Specialist UFD title off the certification list that we asked for from Civil Service.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to appoint Michael Barcellona, Michael Geiger and Keith McGrath to Firefighter Prevention Specialist UFD title off the

certification list which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay Mr. Attorney do you want to give a summary of the Executive Session.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: Yeah the Executive Session involved the following. We of course spoke about the credits that are due for the late submission of the two engines with Campbell Supply. We're going to get them to change some add-ons to the trucks. They'll be an associate coming in with that between the Board and Campbell that will be presented at the next meeting when exactly we receive in exchange for those credits when due. The Board also talked about how to build moral in the volunteer members. We talked about personnel matters Commissioner Pat Kenny just discussed. We also talked about an upcoming town meeting that's going to involve radio systems and warrantees and maintenance of our radio systems and how that might change. And then we got counseled by our labor attorney Eric Bernstein who was present. We discussed issues involving former Employee 1401 and also advised us on our current sick time policy. And we also discussed reviewing training records and training protocols so that we can fully comply with OSHA standards and that concludes the Executive Session.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to adjourn the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously at 8:56 P.M.
